

## 28 Involvement with Charities & Local Organisations

The Festival is committed to support environmental and humanitarian charities and projects, and to assist local causes and groups. This commitment is central to the culture and values of the festival.

The following is an extract from the company objectives of Glastonbury Festivals Ltd.

- The company actively pursues the objective of making a profit, and in so doing, is able not only to make improvements to the site, but also to distribute large amounts of money to Greenpeace, Oxfam, Water Aid and other humanitarian causes, which enhance the fabric of our society. In the running of the event the Festival deliberately employs the services of these organisations, increasing the amounts they can raise towards their objectives.
- The company also runs other events, away from Worthy Farm: an annual fund raising pop concert for Pilton Village in September, and a “Musical Extravaganza” in Glastonbury Abbey in August.
- The company vigorously pursues a policy of support to local economy, schools and social institutions.

Following Glastonbury Festival 2002, a total of over £1m, was paid to charities and local causes. To put this significant amount into context, £1m represented 10% of festival turnover in 2002 (less VAT) – not of profits. Major projects included completing the renovation of the Pilton Working Men’s Club and the virtual completion of the Abbey Barn at Pilton.

Glastonbury Festival 2003 paid in excess of £1,000,000 to charities and local groups. The renovation of the Pilton Parish Hall was one of the projects that benefited that year. This is a lengthy project and monies from Glastonbury Festival 2004 will be used to complete work on the Parish Hall.

In total, following Glastonbury Festival 2004, almost £1m has already been paid to charities and local causes, including a one off donation of £100,000 to Oxfam’s Sudan Crisis appeal - which is additional to the payment of £200,000 already made to Oxfam in recognition of their assistance stewarding at the Festival. Another major project utilising revenue from the 2004 Festival, which is currently in the planning stages, is building a housing scheme, similar to the project completed in 1994. This will involve the provision of land, building materials and an architect to build a further housing scheme for locals who can not afford Pilton prices. Once completed it will be run by a housing association, with affordable rents being implicit

Attached is a list of recipients either of donations or of payment for work done at Glastonbury Festival 2004 by volunteers from that organisation, to date.

Key beneficiaries have provided supportive documentation, which is also appended.

The implementation of this aspect of the company objectives is reflected in various other ways:

- by providing trading opportunities for charities and groups either free or at preferential terms. (A list of organisations that traded at Glastonbury 2004 is also attached.)
- by purchasing products and services from local organisations and commercial suppliers when ever feasible.
- by organising the annual Pilton Party , all profits from which are paid to The Pilton Show Committee to be used on projects in the village. Additional to these monies is the profit the Pilton Show Committee makes from running the bar at the Pilton Party.
- by Michael and Emily Eavis being actively involved with campaigns and other fund raising activities run by key beneficiaries.
